The Diocese of Charleston celebrates Catholic Schools Week in Myrtle Beach

They also celebrate their faith with Mass and a diocesan-wide rosary rally. Additionally, the schools hold various activities to bolster academics, outreach to others, and to just have fun.

This year, the S.C. Legislature passed a joint resolution to commend Catholic schools, students, parents, and teachers across the state for their ongoing contributions to education and for playing a vital role in promoting and ensuring a brighter, stronger future.
