Catholic Charities of South Carolina works to save the smiles of those in need

(CHARLESTON, SC) – In honor of National Dental Hygiene Month, Catholic Charities of South Carolina is celebrating its Save A Smile initiative. The program provides dentures to those in need and includes a comprehensive dental wellness workshop to provide education on the care and maintenance of their dentures.

The lack of functional teeth brings on many challenges including low self-esteem, various health-related issues, difficulty obtaining employment and a feeling of embarrassment and despair. “Dentures are not covered by Medicaid, so many can simply not afford a set of dentures. Catholic Charities established the Save A Smile program to solve that problem,” said Lydia Doyle, executive director of Catholic Charities.

Catholic Charities receives funding from private donations, grants and foundations, but the need continues to grow and these funds are vital to providing the dentures. While over 700 individuals have been given the gift of a smile since the inception of the program, many others are waiting for one, two and sometimes up to 3 years for the phone call that changes their appearance and their lives.
