One Family in Faith

However diverse, the Catholics of our diocese are united by our faith in Christ. We are members of a universal Church that we celebrate in our parishes and homes. We live out and practice our faith as members of one family, the Body of Christ.

In each of our communities, we are led by our pastors – our shepherds – who, as our spiritual leaders, are responsible for guiding us in our everyday lives. Our bishop, the Most Reverend Jacques Fabre-Jeune, continues to provide the leadership and spiritual guidance to the larger Catholic family in South Carolina.

While parishes rely on the financial support of parishioners through weekly offertory collections, the ministries and outreach programs, Catholic schools, Catholic Charities of South Carolina, and vocation, seminarian, and priest support rely on the faithful to make possible the many services provided across the state. The Appeal is an opportunity for every Catholic household to help further the mission of the Church in South Carolina.

This manual has been prepared to familiarize the clergy and lay leadership of the Diocese of Charleston with the operational plan for the 2024 Catholic Appeal of South Carolina.

The Office of Stewardship and Mission Advancement will assist you and your parish with the implementation of the appeal plan to make it a successful endeavor. The Appeal is an organized effort to give every Catholic family in the Diocese of Charleston the opportunity to make a gift to the best of their financial ability.

Thank you for your leadership and support in helping to carry this message to your parishioners!

The Catholic Appeal of South Carolina is designed to:

- Reach out to every Catholic in the Diocese by promoting a *true stewardship way of life*.
- Encourage sacrificial giving that may take the form of a pledge payable over ten months.
- Encourage maximum participation of parishioners.

Throughout the Appeal, the Office of Stewardship & Mission Advancement will provide continued assistance to you and your parish. However, we cannot thank you enough for the great and effective impact parish leadership has on the success of this campaign. Your enthusiasm and commitment help strengthen our Catholic charitable community across the state.

The Office of Stewardship & Mission Advancement is responsible for the following CASC activities:

- Establishing the CASC timeline and case statement of needs.
- Creating and distributing all operative materials, including manuals, brochures, pledge cards, posters, etc.
- Training pastors and volunteers on the CASC presentations and timeline.
- Recording and tracking all contributions to the CASC.
- Providing monthly, online updates regarding donations made to the CASC.
- Sending pledge reminders to donors for the ten-month pledge period.
- Generating thank-you cards and letters to all donors from the diocese.
- Generating tax letters to all who contribute at least \$100 or specifically request a letter.
- Issuing rebates to those parishes that have exceeded their goal.

Resources to Thank Each Parish Donor

Last year, the Office of Stewardship & Mission Advancement partnered with *Reporting Xpress*, a secure third-party data service to provide electronic reports to designated representatives of each parish in our diocese. These reports list the contact information of your parish's current donors to the Catholic Appeal of South Carolina, as well as your parish's overall progress toward its goal. We will continue with *Reporting Xpress* and encourage you to use this insightful resource.

Reporting Xpress provides information to assist your parish (the pastor or chairperson) in offering a personal message of thanks to each parishioner who helps your parish reach its CASC goal. Please take some time with your pastor to determine a system for how your parish will offer thanks to your donors. The diocese will continue to offer a message of thanks from the Bishop to each donor.

What is the significance of this service?

Nationwide surveys show that parishes that directly thank their parishioner-donors are more likely to continue supporting their local annual appeal but also <u>more likely to increase their giving levels to the parish's offertory and other fundraising initiatives</u>. In our ongoing effort to surpass 25% participation, implementation of parish thank you letters to CASC supporters undoubtedly will help with donor retention year-after-year and will ensure your parishioners feel appreciated for their gifts.

How does Reporters Xpress work?

- CASC parish volunteers who are diocesan employees with a <u>@charlestondiocese.org</u> email address can access an online portal where they are able to download their parish's current donor report whenever they want. Instructions to access the online portal will be provided to all parish volunteers who are diocesan employees.
- CASC parish volunteers who are not diocesan employees will receive automatic reports once a month to an e-mail address they provide to the Office of Stewardship & Mission Advancement.

What do the reports show?

• The reports include each individual donor to the CASC from your parish, along with their phone number, e-mail address, and home address. This allows the pastor or chairperson to offer a message of thanks either by phone, e-mail, or letter.

How should the reports be utilized?

- The reports are arranged by the most recent gifts, which make it easy to identify who the newest donors are throughout the year to thank.
- When you receive a report, please take a minute to look it over to see if your parish has a
 new CASC donor. If so, please coordinate with your pastor about who will reach out to
 the donor in thanks for the gift in a timely manner. Sample language for thank-you emails and/or letters are included on page 22.

Leadership Roles

While our office is responsible for the preparation of all Appeal materials and offers assistance and support, the most significant aspects of the Appeal are **organization** and **leadership** at the parish level. Success is very closely tied to these factors and to the individuals who assume leadership roles in the Appeal. Thank you for your enthusiasm and willingness to do what is necessary to make this year's Appeal successful!

On the **DIOCESAN LEVEL**, the Diocese is responsible for the preparation of the appeal plan, timetable, and the production of appeal printed materials such as pledge cards, posters, etc. The Diocese also is responsible for mailing the CASC packet of information to every registered household and provides advice, encouragement, and motivation to parish volunteers and staff.

On the **PARISH LEVEL**, leadership includes the pastor, general chairperson(s), parish secretary, and a small group of appeal volunteers.

The **PASTOR** or parish life facilitator is responsible for the implementation of the appeal plan in his parish. Success of the Appeal depends upon enthusiastic support from the clergy, who is asked to set the pace and tone of the endeavor to optimize support. The pastor is asked to make the appropriate pulpit presentations, so parishioners are adequately informed, prepared, and motivated to participate generously in the Appeal. The Pastor also is responsible for recruiting the general chairperson or other lay speaker to make a presentation at all Masses on the appropriate weekend.

The **PARISH SECRETARY** is responsible for inserting appeal newsletters into the bulletin, processing pledge cards, and keeping in contact with the Office of Stewardship.

The **GENERAL CHAIRPERSON(S)** will be responsible for assisting the pastor during the Appeal, coordinating volunteers, as well as making a pulpit presentation at all Masses on one weekend.

The **APPEAL VOLUNTEERS** are asked to staff tables after Masses to assist fellow parishioners with appeal and pledge card-related questions. Appeal volunteers also are asked to help place extra pledge envelopes in the pews for Pledge Weekend.

Role of the Pastor

- Pray for the success of the Catholic Appeal of South Carolina during Mass and at various parish functions.
- Recruit a chairperson to deliver a pulpit presentation during the Appeal.
- Speak enthusiastically about the Catholic Appeal, outline the program to the entire parish family, and challenge each to consider a pledge over the next ten months to the best of their financial ability.
- Draft an appeal letter to be mailed to all households or printed in the bulletin.
- Assist in planning CASC video to be shown one weekend at all Masses and also deliver via email communication.
- Make a leadership gift to the Catholic Appeal for your parishioners to follow.

Role of the Chairperson(s)

- Be a well-known and recognized parish leader who is a generous and consistent supporter of the parish, making a gift or pledge by the end of January.
- Make a presentation at Mass during the Appeal effort and encourage all parishioners to consider a gift to the best of their financial ability.
- Be sure that all promotional materials and information are presented to parishioners.
- Remain in regular contact with the pastor, appeal volunteers, and Office of Stewardship and Mission Advancement throughout the Appeal.
- BACK IN 2024: As overviewed on the previous page, each chairperson may receive
 electronic reports that list your parish's current donors to the CASC monthly. These
 reports will contain the contact information of each participating parishioner and will be
 organized by the most recent donations. This information should be used by the pastor
 and/or chairperson to reach out to each donor (by letter, e-mail, or phone call) and thank
 them for their support.

Role of the Parish Secretary

- Remain in regular contact with the pastor, general chairperson(s), and Appeal volunteers.
- Ensure that Appeal newsletters provided by our office are copied and inserted into the parish's weekly bulletin and that pledge cards are placed in the pews. Also, place a petition for the Catholic Appeal of South Carolina in the weekly bulletin.
- Maintain regular contact with the Office of Stewardship for materials (brochures, pledge cards, etc.), reports, and other Appeal information.
- Remit all pledge envelopes to the Diocese process center.
- (See separate handout for directions)

Role of the Appeal Volunteers

- Assist the pastor, general chairperson(s), and parish secretary throughout the Appeal.
- Be familiar with all Appeal materials (brochures, pledge cards, etc.).
- Volunteer at information tables after Mass on the appropriate weekends to answer questions concerning the Appeal and assist your fellow parishioners with completing pledge cards.

2024 Catholic Appeal of South Carolina **Timetable**

 - Personalized pledge card and return envelope

<u>February 10-11 — Chairperson Weekend</u>

- General chairperson(s) to speak at all Masses
 - See Pulpit Presentation #2 on page 15
- Newsletter #2 to be inserted into the parish bulletin and circulated via email
- Additional brochures and pledge cards made available at Masses

FEBRUARY 17-18 — PLEDGE WEEKEND

- Pastor to speak
 - See Pulpit Presentation #3 on page 16
- Newsletter #3 inserted into parish bulletin and circulated via email
- Additional pledge cards to be placed in pews and in the back of church
- Volunteers set up and staff "information tables" after all Masses to meet parishioners who have questions about making a pledge
- Pledge cards are given to the parish Secretary who will send them to the Diocese Processing Center See separate directions on processing pledge cards and envelopes.

NOTE: All CASC presentations should take place either at the start of Mass or before the homily. Please have ushers pass out pledge envelopes during **Pledge Weekend.**

KICKOFF WEEKEND (2/3 and 2/4)

To be delivered by the pastor in each parish, either before each Mass or as part of the homily

Today, I would like to announce that our parish is beginning its participation in the annual appeal to strengthen the many critical missions and ministries of the Catholic Church in South Carolina. Formerly known as the Bishop's Annual Appeal, this effort took new direction under Bishop Jacques Fabre-Jeune, CS, and is now known as the Catholic Appeal of South Carolina, or the C.A.S.C.

We join our Catholic brothers and sisters throughout our state to provide support for several essential ministries of our church. Every year, the Appeal challenges us to look outside our parish boundaries and recognize the universal causes of our church. This challenge will not change under the CASC, as it is more important than ever that the statewide programs and ministries are supported by our Catholic community.

Today, we have arranged to watch the 2024 Catholic Appeal video, which highlights some of the ministries that are funded through your generosity.

SHOW APPEAL VIDEO

(Duration - 5 minutes)

Over the next few weeks, you will receive information regarding the Appeal in the mail. You also will be hearing more about the CASC during Mass.

We ask you to make your commitment by or on the weekend of **February 17**th and 18th.

Thank you for your prayerful consideration and support of these important ministries that support our diocese and our local parish.

Additional Comments to Consider:

- Report last year's statistics (did your parish reach goal?)
- Deacons who serve the parish are supported by the CASC
- Is there a local Catholic Charities office that serves and supports your community?
- Are there local college or universities with campus ministry programs?
- Are there seminarians or recently ordained priests who have served or are serving in your parish?
- Do you have youth that have attended CLI, DYC, SEARCH, or other Youth Ministry retreats?

Why Have a Lay Witness?

Inviting the CASC Chairperson (or another lay witness) to speak to the congregation provides increased motivation to participate in the Appeal. The use of a lay witness is an effective means of increasing participation, identifying with a fellow parishioner, and hearing a different perspective on the importance of supporting the funded ministries. It often is said that "people give to people." The lay witness presentation provides parishioners with a peer-to-peer example of why the Catholic Appeal of South Carolina is an important responsibility shared by all members of the Diocese.

Who Should Be Asked To Make The Lay Witness Presentation?

- Generally, this is the role of the CASC Chairperson.
- In any case, the speaker should be the following:
 - An active parishioner
 - An energetic and enthusiastic speaker
 - o A contributor to the Catholic Appeal of South Carolina
 - An active and engaged member of the parish

What Are You Asked To Do As A Lay Witness Presenter?

- Meet with your pastor and attend a Committee Meeting Webinar to review your role as a lay presenter.
- Ensure that the pastor will introduce you at each Mass during the designated weekend.
- Arrange with the pastor for an opportunity to practice from the pulpit in the church.
- Your talk should augment the pastor's thoughts, not serve as a replacement.

Tips for Developing Your Presentation:

- Jot down and outline your thoughts.
- Write out the outline using large, double-spaced print.
- Actual stories and experiences work better than statistics.
- Try to keep your talk less than five minutes in duration.
- Speak from the heart strive to deliver the talk in a sincere, enthusiastic, and friendly manner.

Suggestions in Preparing Your Presentation:

- 1. Speaking from the pulpit requires a level of reverence be aware of your appearance.
- 2. Practice, practice, practice! Rehearse your talk and deliver it to your spouse, family, or friend.
- 3. Speak clearly and more slowly than usual to give your listeners time to follow the presentation.
- 4. Make your gift first. Tell the parishioners that you have pledged your financial support.
- 5. Express gratitude and thanks in your talk and enjoy the experience.

Remittance of Pledges to the Diocese of Charleston

PLEASE NOTE NEW PROCEDURES this year for the return of gifts received at the parish.

- For step-by-step instructions of the new process in 2024, please refer to the detailed *Parish Gift Processing Packet* received at the Training Meetings.
- Beginning the weekend of February 5, each parish should expect to receive pledges in both a special collection as well as through the offertory collection in the following weeks.
- Gifts received at the parish may come directly in the mail to the parish or in the pew during Sunday mass. It is critical that all donations be sent to the Gift Collections Center.
- Do not send donations and envelopes to the Diocese this year.
- Each parish will receive return-addressed Tyvek "mailing bags" with their CASC 2024 materials delivery. You will use the Tyvek bags to mail gifts received at your parish directly to the processing center.
- Please DO NOT hold parishioners' envelopes in your office for more than one week before mailing them. This causes many checks to be returned due to insufficient funds, it also prevents us from practicing good stewardship by thanking donors in a timely manner. Thank you so much for your help.

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

As we begin the Catholic Appeal of South Carolina, I encourage your sacrificial support as we join this effort with Catholics throughout our state.
